It hathe pleazed God this mornyng too make mee powrar by one boye then beefore I was, Hys wyll bee doonne in all thynges, Whowm I praye euer too bee yowr Lordships defence, & too direct all yowr actions too his glorie, yowr cuntries proffitt, & yowr owane happynes, so humble leaue I take. / Dublin this xxiijth of march Anno
